Almost inevitably the work to the highway at the bottom of Cripple Street by Millwood Homes has over-run. The developers who are building on Dimmock's Field, now say the road will stay closed until July 24 (so bear this in mind when travelling to the barbecue - come via the Tovil end of the valley).

On some days the road has even been closed to pedestrians. This should not have happened. Our ward councillor Brian Clark has intervened with KCC who have now instructed Millwood to keep pedestrian access open.

# Fishermen's wall of shame



Residents at Hayle Mill had to call for help from Swan and Friends Bird Rescue after oil was poured over the back of the female of the pair of swans on their pond.

They are convinced the attack was carried out by a fisherman who had earlier told them: "I'll come back and you'll see what I can do" after they told him to stop fishing.

The man is extremely aggressive and threatening and his behaviour has been reported to the police. He is in his late 20s, tall with fair hair, and often accompanied by a young woman and a child.

The swan rescue team discovered that as well as the oil, both the pen and cob swans had a fish hook lodged in their bills.




A vast quantity of discarded fishing line and hooks was recovered from the pond.

The incident follows a series of clashes with fishermen on our own ponds at Lower Crisbrook and Reeds ponds, where one of our own volunteers was threatened.

Fishing is NOT allowed in any of the ponds in the valley.
